


Total Days Suspended for All Students: Findings

There are 57 less days of total suspension than what we saw Year to Date at this time last year.


When we look at the last two weeks before we pulled this information and include the same time frame from last year we see 42% fewer days suspended (335).



Students with Multiple Suspensions for All Students Findings

There are 364 fewer students with multiple suspensions year to date.


Over the last two weeks in December there were 114 fewer students with multiple suspensions.



Total Number of Unique Students Suspended for All Students: Findings

There are 39 **more** unique students suspended year to date.

the last two weeks in December compared to the same time frame last year is 111 fewer students.



Suspension Rates for All Students: Findings

The Suspension rates for year to date are 4% lower than at the same time last year.

The suspension rates for the last two weeks in December are 5% lower than for the same time frame last year.

The YTD information for the present year represents "live data" – there may be errors in the data that are not yet cleaned up...

The data accountability section of DREA (Student data entry and State reporting teams) have worked with the data warehouse team established a process to identify data irregularities through audit reports in our data warehouse.

The network support clerks provide these error reports to:
Assistant Superintendents, Principals and School Data Support Specialists to have the data irregularity addressed (either verify that the data are correct or verify and correct an error)
