





Pittsburgh Obama

★ It is necessary for you to complete the attached information and submit it to the school nurse during the first week of school.

The following forms (#1-5) are required for students:

1. **Emergency Care Form** – kept on file in their health record and in the office for emergencies
 - This form must be completed (front and back) and signed by parent/guardian. This form is very important, as it contains contact phone numbers, medical information, allergies to be aware of, and also contains consent for the school nurse to treat your child with specific over-the-counter medications at school.
2. **Child's Medical History** – kept on file in their health record
 - This form must be completed and signed by parent/guardian.
3. **Physical Exam** – mandated by the state for children in Sixth grade and Ninth grade
 - The physical form attached may be completed by your child's doctor or they may use their own form. We are required to have a copy of this physical exam in their school record by the state law.
4. **Immunizations** – required by State and County Law
 - Your child must be up to date and a copy of their records must be given to the nurse.
 - 7th grade requirements as follows: TDAP and MCV4 (1st dose)
 - 12th grade requirements as follows: MCV4 (2nd dose)
5. **Family Dentist Report** – mandated by the state for children in Seventh grade, ELS
 - The dental exam form attached may be completed by your child's dentist or they may use their own form. If your child does not have a dentist, there are referrals listed.

The following forms (#6-9) are only required for some students  the explanation next to the form number to see if it applies to your child):

6. **If your child takes a daily medication at school**, the “Consent for Administration of medication” form needs to be signed by you the parent and the child’s doctor. This is only for children who need lunch medication at school. Morning medications are to be given at home before school. All medications (pills, liquid, inhalers, and injections) need to be given to the school nurse in the original labeled pharmacy container. No other containers will be accepted-no exceptions.
7. **If your child needs to keep a rescue medication** (such as an inhaler or Epi-Pen) on file, the “Rescue Medication” form needs to be filled out. The medication needs to be sent to the school with this form in order for it to be administered. Inhalers and Epi- pens needs to be sent to school in the original labeled pharmacy box only. Be sure to have one at home also.
8. **If your child has a severe allergy**, the “Anaphylactic Allergy Action Plan” form along with the doctor’s order for their rescue medication must be completed and submitted to the school nurse in case of an emergency.
9. **If your child has any food intolerances or allergies**, the “Medical Plan of Care for School Food Services” form needs to be filled out by you the parent/guardian and the child’s doctor. This form is shared with the cafeteria director and allows your child to be served a special diet.
10. **If your child is a diabetic**, the medication administration form will need to be filled out by the doctor and parent/guardian along with the diabetic plan of care please contact the school nurse and we will update any 504 plans.
