BACKGROUND

PIAA District 8/City League

 Comprised only of Pittsburgh Public Schools -Allderdice, Brashear, Carrick, Obama, Milliones, Science and Technology, Perry, Westinghouse

PIAA District 7/WPIAL

 Comprised of 138 school districts in Western Pennsylvania.



BACKGROUND CONTINUED

- Last 3 years Westinghouse football team averaged 23 players. (Info obtained from RTI and rosters submitted)
- 3-year average of the other schools playing football is 50 players.
- As smaller high schools have closed (Peabody,
 Oliver, Langley) it has reduced the number of teams
 Westinghouse can compete against.
- Varsity/JV contests with same players.



PITTSBURGH WESTINGHOUSE REQUEST

- Pittsburgh Westinghouse 6-12 requests of the District 8/City League committee to become an associate member of the District 7/WPIAL in the sport of football for the 2014-2015 school year.
- Reason for the request is based on competitive imbalance and safety concerns regarding playing teams with much larger participation numbers and greater student populations



REVIEW of PIAA DISTRICTS

- A review of PIAA District 5(Johnstown Area), 6
 (Altoona Area) & 7 (WPIAL) occurred between
 November and January to determine feasibility.
- Results: Districts 5 & 6 were not interested in adding a school in football. Travel was a major concern.
- WPIAL/District 7 is most feasible alternative given the proximity of Westinghouse to other schools in WPIAL.

RECOMMENDATION

District 8 approve Pittsburgh Westinghouse 6-12 request for associate membership to the WPIAL/District 7 for the 2014-2015 school year in the sport of football.

RATIONALE

Approval allows for Pittsburgh Westinghouse 6-12 to play in their appropriate enrollment classification for the size of their school and competition level.



REMAINING SCHOOLS IN CITY LEAGUE

- Remaining schools compete in City League playing each opponent twice for a total of 8 games of league play plus 1 game available for non-league competition. (Endorsed by High School Principals)
- Current format is for each school to play each other once and then secure 3 additional non league contests. Travel for these contests include trips to Ohio, West Virginia and Maryland.



TIMELINE

<u>June 2013</u> – School Board of Pittsburgh Public Schools update – Education Committee meeting.

<u>June 2013</u> – PIAA district 8 committee votes on Westinghouse request.

<u>June 2013</u> – If approved a letter from District 8 to the WPIAL requesting inclusion in the sport of football occur for the 2014-2015 school year on behalf of Westinghouse.

<u>July 2013</u> – WPIAL/District 7 votes to approve/not approve request.

<u>February 2014</u> – If WPIAL approves, Westinghouse receives a schedule for next 2 years and is eligible for post season play.
