- How we plan to increase student achievement: School Improvement Goals

Principal presented School Improvement Plan and explained Whittier's Strengths and Challenges. The following things were explained: PBIS, African American Achievement Gap at Whittier.

Jackie Trevisan (Reading Coach) will explained details of Whittier's literacy curriculum Open Court, math (Go Math!) and science (Carolina Science), and which literacy skills students will be working on throughout the year.

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Parents will be given parent friendly Standards for each grade level.

Parents were notified by mail about PSSA statewide exams. CDT is an exam administered (typically) 3 times per year to identify each students' proficiency in PA Common Core standards for Reading, Math, and Science. The exams give teachers insight into students' progress, and how to use the data to better assist each student toward proficiency.
