 - How to get involved and participate in your child's education

 - **Must fill out form and obtain clearances to volunteer in the school or on field trips.**
 - **Without clearances families can still be involved by helping from home: sorting, cutting, stuffing envelopes, stapling, etc.**

- Cell Phone Policy
 - Request for input-parents agreed with current policy-phones collected during homeroom by the homeroom teacher and returned at end of day.
 - Parent concern that students are getting on bus to Greenway with their cell phones. Needs to be addressed with staff, as sometimes the bus comes prior to homeroom.

- Questions and Answers
 - Parents felt disconnected from school last year and year prior.
 - Don't feel that they are welcome or that their opinion matters.
 - Multiple suggestions of having hybrid meetings to try to help with the two concerns above.
 - Have a school wide message about volunteering sent on Talking Points from Mrs. Laurent or Mrs. Safran with suggestions of how to volunteer include the link for clearances and intake form
 - Homeroom teachers follow up with personalized examples of how parents with and without clearances can help in their classroom.
