2012-13 Magnet Lottery Application Deadline December 16th

PITTSBURGH, December 5, 2011---All current Pittsburgh Public Schools students wishing to participate in the *2012-13 Magnet Lottery* must submit their application no later than **Friday, December 16th at 5:00PM**. The application deadline for Pittsburgh CAPA 6-12 was October 21, 2011. The Magnet Lottery will be held Wednesday, December 21, 2011. After the Magnet Lottery, all current Pittsburgh Public Schools students who wish to apply to a District magnet school or program must do so by March 16, 2012.

Applications are being accepted on a first come first serve basis and can be mailed or dropped off in person between 8:30 am -12:30 pm and 1:30 pm - 4:30 pm at 341 South Bellfield Avenue, Room 453A, Pittsburgh PA, 15213.
