Pittsburgh Schenley to Celebrate Class of 2008 International Baccalaureate Diploma Recipients

PITTSBURGH, December 19, 2008 – Twenty-nine students of the Class of 2008 International Baccalaureate Programme will be honored during a recognition ceremony held at Pittsburgh Schenley High School on Monday, December 22 at 9:30 a.m. Pittsburgh Schenley is located 129 Denniston Avenue in the Reizenstein facility.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme is a two-year comprehensive and rigorous pre-university curriculum leading to an IB Diploma for highly motivated secondary school students ages 16 to 19. Successful IB candidates are typically granted advanced placement credits at many colleges and universities. Some IB Diploma recipients may begin their college programs as sophomores.

Each student's performance is measured against well-defined levels of achievement. These are consistent from one examination session to the next and are all equally applied to all schools who participate in the Diploma Programme. Students who receive the IB Diploma must receive passing grades in six IB subjects, write an independent research paper, fulfill150 hours of community service and demonstrate an understanding of the Theory of Knowledge. Students who have received an IB Certificate have received passing grades in 1 to 5 IB subjects.

This year 42 students will participate in Pittsburgh Schenley's 22^{nd} IB examination session. From this group, 21 diploma candidates will attempt to add their names to the list of 209 Schenley graduates on whom this prestigious honor has been bestowed. The Class of 2011 will be the last class to graduate from the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme at Pittsburgh Schenley.

In June, the Board authorized the opening of the new 6-12 International Baccalaureate (IB) school at the Reizenstein facility for the start of the 2009-10 school year. Pittsburgh Frick IB/IS students will become part of the new school, which will open with grades 6-10 and have a capacity for 750 students. As grades 11 and 12 are added over time, the total student population will grow to 1,050.
